From the Chairman

To the township residents of Town of Cleveland, Marathon County,

As I am writing this newsletter and I look outside, it's hard to believe the winter we have had—very little snow as of this day (March 16). I think Luke has graded more than he has snowplowed roads this winter.

We have a busy summer planned for the township. Two of our bigger projects this year are:

- 1. Blacktop is planned for Balsam Road from Hwy M up to what is known as Spindler bridge, which amounts to just under two miles of road. The plan is to go with a 24-foot-wide blacktop surface with three-foot gravel shoulders. Most of the road is 32 feet (plus) in width already. This project is planned to be completed before the middle of October or sooner.
- 2. Most of the township is aware of the plan for a new grader/equipment shed. We will be using the bulk of our ARPA funds to launch this project. The location of the new shed is just west of the current recycling center. Ratsch Engineering is the firm we have hired to oversee the project. Completion date for the project is planned for the 18th of November or sooner. We should know who is awarded the bid by the date of our annual meeting which is April 17th.

Dust control will again be important to get done timely and efficiently to ensure road safety this spring and summer. We have ditching that needs to be done on some of the roads in the township so the roads drain properly. We will apply gravel to roads as needed.

Grading and application of calcium chloride for dust control is most effective after rainfall. Getting the longest use per application of the calcium chloride before the next grading of the road ensures we get the most out of the product and the time spent to apply. Each time a road is graded, the dust control becomes less effective. We need to do our best to

manage several variables, most of which we do not control (i.e. weather), as we prepare roads for each application. Also, spring soft spots need to be graded out before dust control can be applied; soft spots were a problem for a longer time than usual last spring.

We were not awarded any state or federal funds for projects this year, however this will not deter us from applying for other state and federal grants that become available for townships. We are aware that more may come online in the coming months.

Our annual meeting is coming up on Wednesday, April 17th starting at 7:00 p.m. Our agenda is included in this newsletter. Your attendance and participation are much appreciated.

Roads Update

Weight Limit Signs

Spring will be here before we know it and so will the posting of weight limit signs on township roads. These signs are posted when the frost is coming out of the ground to preserve the integrity of the roads and prevent damage.

When weight limit signs are posted, a single or multiple use permit is required for vehicles and or/loads over the posted limits. The Marathon County Highway Department will issue a permit if you need one and it should be kept in the vehicle when traveling on posted roads. Single Use permit applications can be found on the Town of Cleveland's website under Forms & Permits.

Traffic Signs

Recently, it was noticed that traffic signs have been removed and left lying in the

ditch on township roads. If you notice a traffic sign is missing or lying in a ditch, please contact a board member or Luke to have the sign replaced as soon as possible.

Road Maintenance

Township roads are routinely traveled to assess their conditions; however, situation come up after the last inspection that may need immediate attention. If you see a township road with unsafe driving conditions like a washed-out road, extremely large potholes, downed trees over the road, or damage to a bridge or culvert, please reach out to a board member or Luke to assess the road to make sure it is repaired and safe to travel on.

Special Notes

Please make sure to tie down bags, barrels and loose garbage when bringing to the garbage collection site. We have found bags of garbage and other items in the ditches. Let's keep our township clean!

Please do not include any sharp metal, batteries, diapers, needles, hard covered books, light bulbs, paper plates and cups, food, scrap-wood, and clothing in the recycling bin. These items should go in the regular garbage bins. There are separate bins for aluminum cans and tin and one for cardboard/paper. All other recycling can be mixed. Please no garbage bags in recyclable bins. If you bring your recyclables in bags, they will need to be dumped out and sorted.

Other items such as appliances, tires, household items can be taken to Bee Line north of Stratford on Hwy 97. Televisions and computer monitors can be taken to Marshfield Scrap for 35 cents a pound (715-389-1915). Marshfield Technology will take keyboards and phones. (715-502-4585)

Remember at the Cleveland recycling center we have a designated area for brush and grass clippings. We are looking into having the brush pile chipped.
